Join us for our first summer field tour of the 2019 season in Washington County. We will be visiting two stream restoration projects completed on Wagner Forest Management land last summer in Princeton. Discussions will include: Atlantic Salmon Habitat Restoration by Project SHARE (Salmon Habitat and River Enhancement), challenges of Atlantic Salmon habitat crossings and feasibility of using concrete bridge panels on bridges.

Following the field visits, we will travel to Woodland, to visit the brand new St. Croix Tissue facility next to the Woodland Pulp Mill.

Carpooling will be the mode of transportation for the tour. If you are traveling from the south, west, or north and would like to meet the group in Bangor we will be meeting at the park and ride off exit 182B on I-95. The group will leave the park and ride at 7 am and meet the speakers and other participants who plan to meet the group in Princeton. The meeting place is the end of the Pocomoonshine Mountain Road off the South Princeton Road in Princeton (map available on our website). If you are willing to carpool with someone please make sure and indicate on the registration form. Hardhats, boots and pants (no shorts) are required for the tour of the Tissue Mill.
